now have at least 3 charter student members. The UC student chapter will play a vital role in strengthening our membership and leadership into the future. In fact, UC's CEAS team won, for the second year in a row, the National Construction Management Competition between 25 colleges and Universities. I would like to thank the Board and past presidents for offering me sound guidance over the past year as President. It has been especially rewarding to me to be able to get to know the membership outside the general membership meetings. I would like to thank the committees for their extensive work in supporting the section programs. I will hopefully see everyone at our May 24th meeting for an exciting presentation on the Jeremiah Morrow Bridge replacement. Please have a safe and productive summer!

Here we are again, at the beginning of summer of 2011, and the nation still does not have a Transportation Bill. I've already heard the dreaded words "its dead!" Let's take a look at where the Transportation Bill stands. The deadline for passage is September 30, 2011, when the current extension expires. The general consensus is that if the bill is not passed by then, that the 2012 Presidential Election will delay any hope of getting a Transportation Bill until 2013 at the earliest.

To date, there have been three groups working on a proposed Transportation Bill. The President's version of the bill, which was recently released, has not changed much from his past versions in that it focuses on the multi-modal transportation network as opposed to just the highway system. The bill still contains monies for high speed rail, despite the fact that funding of highspeed rail was eliminated from the last budget. It not only contains language for highway funding but also for the Livable Communities Program including funding programs for Transportation Enhancements, Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) Improvement Program, National Scenic Byways Program, and Safe Routes to School. It also contains language to allow state and local governments more flexibility to impose roadway and bridge tolls on existing Interstate and non-interstate facilities for the purposes of improving or reducing congestion in metropolitan areas with populations over one million people and on the national Interstate system, permitting state and local governments to impose tolls to initially construct Interstate facilities and/or constructing one or more lanes. The President would create a study group to examine the feasibility of mileagebased user fees instead of the current gasoline tax. Representative Mica, Chair of the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee, is on the verge of introducing his version of the bill. He held numerous sessions throughout the country to gather ideas to incorporate into the House version of the bill in February and March. The House bill would likely include lower funding levels at \$270 billion for the 6 year program than previously in SAFETEA-LU and focus on alternate funding such as an Infrastructure Bank, tolls as well as streamlining the process. While initial reports had the House bill on the floor in April, it now appears the bill will be introduced in June. The Senate Environment and Public Works Committee version of the bill is also slated for introduction in June. Word is the Senate version will have higher funding levels than the House version, and that the programs are more aligned with the President's agenda. The reconciliation of these three versions of the Transportation Bill will make for a really hot and hectic summer this year if the bill will really be signed into law by September 30, 2011.

The ASHE PIN urges you to make your opinion heard about the pending Transportation Bill. Contact your legislators by phone, email or meeting and let them know that passing a Transportation Bill cannot wait until 2013!

The meeting was adjourned at 1:05 pm.


