ASHE PIN Report - May 2014

The bond issue supporting Issue 1, the Ohio Public Works Commission bond initiative, passed on the May 6 ballot, with 66% of the voters in favor of the bond issue. Thanks to all of the ASHE members that assisted with the yard sign campaign, and those who voted for Issue 1. This 10-year renewal includes \$1.875 billion in financing, which accounts for an increase in annual funding from \$150 million to \$175 million in the first five years, and \$200 million in the last five years, and will create an additional 35,000 jobs over the next decade.

While a win was made in Ohio for Roads and Bridges, little movement can be seen at the national level with the new transportation bill. President Obama has introduced a four-year, \$302 billion transportation bill to Congress that would open the door for states to collect tolls on interstate highways, only with each Governor's request and DOT approval, to raise revenue for roadway repairs. In addition, the proposal would also rely on \$150 billion in corporate tax reforms to close the difference between the revenues from the gasoline user's fee and the \$302 billion proposal. The proposal gives priority to the existing road network, rather than expansions. The TIFIA program and reforms to streamline environmental reviews would both be expanded.

Meanwhile, Senator Barbara Boxer's Environment and Public Works committee will release its version of the transportation bill the week of May 12. This proposal will be for current funding levels, plus inflation, which would cost approximately \$18 billion per year above the revenue collected from the gasoline user's fee. On the other hand, the House Republicans have not released a transportation bill to date, but they have made it known that they are against increasing funding for federal transportation projects, unless these projects could be paid with funds in-hand.

The real issue at hand is funding, or the lack thereof. The budget office has said that the funding shortfall must be found in other areas of the federal budget, or by approving an additional 15 cents-per-gallon increase over the current 18.4 cents per gallon federal gasoline user's fee to meet existing needs. From tolling the interstate, corporate reforms, or even repatriation, which involves increasing taxes on overseas capital to generate extra revenue, a few things are clear:

- 1) No one is denying that our infrastructure is important; and
- 2) Agreement over a source of funding will be the turning point in a new transportation bill.

However, as we draw closer to the highway cliff, Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx said the bankruptcy in the Highway Trust Fund would cost the U.S. 700,000 construction jobs. Many State DOT's are already pulling construction projects slated to start this year. President Obama is already stumping for the importance of this bill while recently visiting major construction projects. We need the Congressional Leadership to take action and pass this bill before the bankruptcy becomes a reality. Please contact your local representatives in Congress and let them know your position!

ASHE-TRIKO Valley General Membership Meeting Minutes

Tuesday March 18, 2014 - Montgomery Inn

President Loeffler called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance at 11:45 am. He thanked members for registering online and announced that we have enhanced the newsletter. Matt then went over some upcoming events, including Happy Hour at Dave and Busters to celebrate spring and basketball at 4:00 on Friday, and a Contractors Material Company stainless steel tour on April 16th. There will also be a Reds event on Tuesday, June 3rd, and our golf outing planned for Friday, June 27th, at the Vineyard. Guests recognized included Travis Baker with URS, John Girdler with Trans Systems, and Ken Hanna and Joe Burkhart with Cardinal HTC. Matt announced that we have a busy CIP program today with a new format to present upcoming projects, followed by a panel discussion. President Loeffler asked us to formulate some good questions for the panel.

In Eric Kistner's absence, Matt presented the Treasurers report, noting an operating capital of \$24,516.09. Expenses included a Wild Apricot upgrade. There are currently 169 members, including 4 student members. Eric Beck raised a motion to accept the treasurer's report, seconded by Caroline Duffy. The motion passed.

David Emerick presented the Secretary's report, noting that minutes from the January 28th meeting were posted in the newsletter and are also available on the back table.

Caroline Duffy presented the Regional Report, stating that the first board meeting of the restructured Great Lakes Region Board was held on February 27th. Two region committee chair positions are still open, including the Technical/Scanner and Student Membership committees. The limits for our section project awards are changed to above and below \$5 million next year to correspond with the region award program. The region is also looking for volunteers to assist in reviving the Circle City section and start sections in Lexington and Detroit.

Caroline also presented the PIN report, noting that there has been some movement of the new Highway Bill in both houses and that tax reform and a long term solution are needed. She also noted that the OPWC is up for renewal on ballot this May and will be backed by the Strong Ohio Communities Campaign.

There was no report for the newsletter and scanner. Information was solicited on member profiles, projects and job opportunities.

Brad Ackel presented the golf committee report, stated that date is June 27th at the Vineyard on east side of town. Registration is \$90 per golfer, which includes cart and door prizes. Hole sponsorships are \$125. This is the sole means to fund two scholarships, so please participate. Registration forms are available at door and on the web site. The website is not yet set up to accept payments.

Steve Mary reported on the Union Terminal high steel tour, which was attended by eight persons. He also reminded us of the stainless steel rebar plant tour. The committee is also looking at some other project tours. Please submit your tour ideas to Steve. The stainless steel tour is limited to 20 persons.

Abundant professional development opportunities are available to further skills and abilities through a comprehensive conference schedule and expansive networking opportunities.

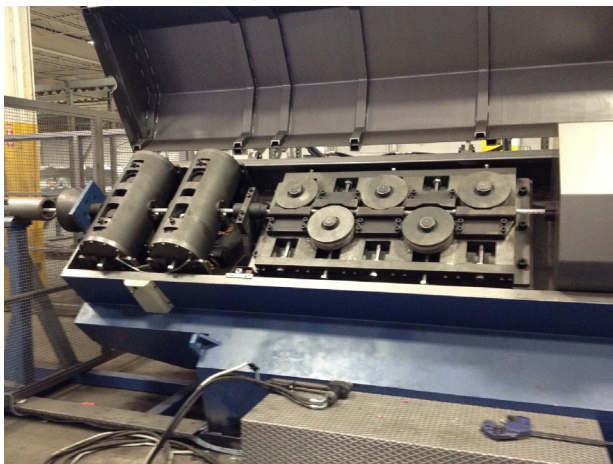

Contractors Materials Company Tour

On April 16th, our section held a technical tour at Contractors Materials Company (CMC) in Cincinnati to learn more about stainless steel rebar. Stainless steel rebar is growing as more state DOTs and Canada are using it for bridge decks and other applications. The tour was well worth it, especially to see how a coil of #8 rebar is straightened and cut to 30-foot lengths. CMC has machines that can even uncoil #11 rebar, which is quite impressive.

Tour guests learned that the stainless steel rebar must always be handled with nylon slings and/or ropes to avoid discolorations. Any discoloration on the stainless steel rebar can cause concern from the uneducated that the stainless steel has corroded, and may be rejected. Thus, all stainless steel rebar is to avoid contact with all other metals and must be elevated from the ground surface.
