Congress enacted the Surface Transportation Reauthorization and Reform Act of 2015, also known as the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (the FAST Act) on Dec. 4, 2015. The bill once again leaves the gas tax untouched. Please continue to voice your opinion to our elected officials who represent us.

We had a great turnout for our annual holiday party at Yard House in downtown Cincinnati. All in attendance had a great time with lots of food and drinks. It appears that we have hit on a good time/ venue option that allowed more people to attend.

ASHE PIN Report - January 2016

Santa Claus did deliver this Christmas! The FAST Act, or the 'Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act' was passed after 33 extensions (Seems Congress does have a sense of humor!). The legislation provides for a \$305 billion to fund the highway bill, increasing funding by 11% over the next five years. This long term funding provides the stability that many DOT's need to facilitate large capacity building projects into their program. However, the source of this long-term funding are one-time gains, such as cutting dividend payments from the Federal Reserve to banks with more than \$10B in assets, reallocating unspent earmark monies, and continued infusions of \$70B from the general revenue fund. The sustainable funding source that is needed for our country's transportation system is still elusive.

While the 93% apportions of the Highway Trust Fund back to the states and the basic program structure has remained the same, some features of the FAST act that have changed include the following:

The amount of funding for the Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (TIFIA) program, is a loan program that encourages innovative financing, has been reduced. However, the minimum project size has been lowered, opening opportunities for projects that would have otherwise not been eligible for TIFIA funding. The minimum threshold is now \$10M for all projects with significant local government involvement and for transit-oriented-developments. TIFIA funds may be used to capitalize State Infrastructure Banks to make financing more accessible for rural projects.

Steamlining project delivery through an improved review and permitting process. The application processes for Departmental credit programs will be improved by streamlined review and transparent approval processes. Coordination of the progress of environmental review and permitting process are being revised to be consistent with the Department's goals to improve project timelines by giving FHWA a year to develop a process to implement this streamlining.

Multimodal programs will experience proportionate funding increases for both highway and transit programs. The National Significant Projects refocus resources to invest in highway freight infrastructure, including projects of national and regional significance. It improves passenger rail infrastructure and safety programs, reduces costs, leverages private sector resources, creates greater accountability and transparency for Amtrak, and accelerates rail project delivery. Trail, pedestrian, and Safe Routes to School funding will continue under this bill.

Many agencies have reviewed the bill and commented that their programs are still in the status quo for the coming years. Many see this funding as helping make up shortfalls and not necessarily an increase in funding. Cost savings may be realized as streamlining is mandated with a deadline, which will save time and money. Now that the FAST Act is here, appropriations of the funding is critical. Please continue to contact your Congressional leadership to encourage them to pass the appropriations of the funding in a timely manner.




