The concession stands are located on the first-base side concourse of the View Level, behind Section 428, and on the right field concourse of the Terrace Level, behind Section 144.

ASHE PIN Report

Although President Trump released his vision for a new transportation bill, there has been no movement in Congress to craft a bill that everyone can agree to replace the 2015 'Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act' (FAST), which is set to expire in 2020. However, the FAST Act has been appropriated this year. Of that total, about \$1 billion would come from the Highway Trust Fund to meet the \$44.2-billion authorized level set in the 2015 Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act. The other \$2.5 billion would come from the general fund. This is an increase of \$2.5 billion above FAST Act levels. Changes to the programs in the FAST Act include the following:

- An increase in the Surface Transportation Block Grant program formula, with eligibility limited to highways, bridges and tunnels. An additional \$225 million is set aside for a new competitive grant program for bridge replacement or rehabilitation projects in rural areas.
- Transit programs receive a total of \$13.5 billion, including \$9.7 billion in FAST Act formula grants and an additional \$834 million from the General Fund. The bill provides \$2.6 billion for capital investment grants, an increase of \$232 million above FY'17. The bill also provides an additional \$400 million for state of good repair formula grants.
- TIGER multimodal grants are increased to \$1.5 billion, \$1 billion more than last year. The maximum grant size is capped at \$25 million, and 30 percent is set aside for rural areas.

With the lack of committment on the federal level, KYTC Secretary Greg Thomas has said "We can't count on Washington to provide more money to address these transportation challenges. As we move into the summer construction season, we have to closely monitor our cash balance due to a significant number of projects in the pipeline, as well as substantial debt payments the Cabinet owes beginning in June. Our top priorities will be limited to projects that improve safety, repair bridges and pavement and support job growth." KYTC recently passed a six-year Highway Plan, which prioritizes the most pressing needs in the Commonwealth, to include \$8.5 billion for more than 1,400 projects, such as bridge and pavement improvements, road widening, reconstruction of existing roads, and new routes and interchanges. The plan includes \$4.6 billion for mobility and safety projects, \$2.3 billion for bridge and pavement repairs, \$1 billion in federally dedicated programs (such as transportation enhancements and congestion reduction programs) and \$600 million for federal GARVEE debt service payments. The \$2.68 billion biennium spending plan authorizes construction efforts to move forward on nearly 400 bridge repairs and replacements across the state, 1,275 lane miles of pavement improvements and 230 mobility and safety projects. Still the Commonwealth has over \$5 billion in projects that have been removed from the program and more than half of the current 9,700-lane-mile of pavement in poor condition.

The future of Ohio's funding lies with the 2018 governor's race. The ASHE PIN urges you to contact those running for governor and help educate them on the need for additional transportation funding in Ohio.

General Membership Meeting Minutes

President Vanessa Nghiem called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance at 11:35 AM, and recognized several guests.

Nghiem announced that the January meeting minutes were published in the newsletter. She also noted that the PIN report was published in the newsletter with a summary being that President Trump had announced his new infrastructure plan, but a sustainable funding stream is still needed.

Eric Kistner presented the Treasurer's report, noting an operating capital of \$28,651.54. Expenses totaled \$1,607.74 and income totaled \$2,381.56.

Stan Harris gave a Newsletter/Scanner report and noted that the Spring issue of the Scanner will be delayed due to injuries sustained by the person who edits and publishes it. Along those lines, if anyone needs information on the upcoming National Conference in Cleveland, they should consult the national web site. Stan also noted that preparations for the National Conference were going well and it will have tremendous social and technical programs. All were encouraged to attend.

Steve Mary presented the program report. The May program will involve the new roller coaster at Kings Island. A possible summer tour is a return trip to view progress at 5th/3rd Arena. For the September program, Steve is exploring a speaker from the Smart Ohio program.

Brian Rhodes presented the membership report. He welcomed two new members and mentioned the ongoing membership drive. If anyone fills out the membership application, they should note who the name of the sponsoring member.

Joe Schmeltzer gave the Scholarship Committee report. The information is on the web site and applications are due May 18. Encourage your coop students to apply.

Tom Nicholson announced that our first Adopt-A-Highway effort will take place on April 21 at the northwest quadrant of the I-71/SR 126 interchange. Look for more information soon.

President Nghiem gave the Social Committee report. We are planning a Reds game outing on June 6. WTS will be joining with us.

Golf Committee chair Katie Dillenburger announced that the golf outing will take place May 7 at Aston Oaks. We need sponsors.

President Nghiem announced that it is the time of the year we are looking for officer candidates and committee members. Please reach out to any of the board members.

Some issues discussed included the \$5 permissive license plate fee, Brent Spence bridge, Kentucky pension funding issues, projects near the Greater Cincinnati Airport and March Madness predictions.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:00 pm.



ASHE TRIKO Valley Scholarships




