ASHE PIN (Political Information Network) REPORT March 2008

1. Commercial Activity Tax

The suit related to the Commercial Activity Tax will be filed in the very near future in the Common Pleas Court of Franklin County. At that point it will be assigned to a judge and scheduled on the docket. The suit will ask that the distribution of the CAT-generated revenue to the general revenue fund be declared unconstitutional.

2. NCEES Model Law

Both Ohio and California delegation have written letters to the national ACEC opposing the NCEES Model Law (BS +30 requirement - Bachelors plus 30 hours for PE). This may start a trend in opposition to the model law.

3. Federal Gas Tax

No change in status.

4. Bush Cool to States' Call for Public Works Projects

President Bush rebuffed appeals from the nation's governors to increase spending on roads, bridges and other public works as a way to revive the economy. A bipartisan group of governors is pushing for major road and bridge projects as a way to create jobs and foster economic development. The President will not accept any bill that raises taxes to finance such projects.

5. Strickland Pushes Bond Issue

Strickland's bond package would include \$150 million for infrastructure. The statutory language for the bond package remains under development. The administration expects it to be introduced in bill form over the next few weeks.

Tuesday, January 22, 2008 Montgomery Inn Boathouse

President Duffy opened the meeting at 11:45 AM with the Pledge of Allegiance and the introduction of thirteen guests. It was announced that George Kral, George's wife and Len Stahl's wife Carol passed on.

The 50th anniversary of ASHE will be celebrated at the National Conference this year in Hershey, Pa. The Triko Valley section was commended for the highest combination of scholarships awarded and donations to charity in Region One.

The Board of Directors has made the following nominations for officers for next year:

We are looking for nominations for a first year director. The Board will also have to appoint a new Regional Representative. Both of these positions are three-year terms. Nominations will be accepted until the March 11th meeting when voting will take place.

Copies of the Treasurer's report and Secretary's report are available on the table in the hallway.

As the Scholarship Committee Chairman, John Davidson has recently presented to UC and is asking members to request that students submit scholarship applications. We had an excellent turnout of ten students for the Holiday meeting.

PIN Chair Greg Wilkens announced that the President signed the THUD bill and that the CAT Tax is looking for a declaratory judgement. They are soliciting two additional plaintiffs. ODOT is anticipating a \$3.5 billion deficit in major new funding by 2015. A statewide 21st Century Transportation Priorities Task Force will be created to consider how best to focus investments to balance the movement of people and freight, promote safety and reduce congestion, create jobs, encourage responsible growth, and help build sustainable communities. There have been no new developments regarding the Model Law. A federal commission created by Congress called for big increases to the federal gas tax as part of a sweeping overhaul of how America builds and pays for its highways, bridges and transit systems. Recommendations include toll proposals.

Jim Collins presented the Regional report. A national Board meeting was held on January 12th in Orlando. It was recommended that a group photo and the 50th anniversary logo be added to the section website. The Cuyahoga Valley section will absorb the Western Reserve section. There are currently 6100 members in ASHE nationwide. The next National Conference will be held in June in Hershey, Pa. Registration is available on line starting March 1st. The proposal to raise dues is dead. National is looking for suggestions on who the Scanner should be sent to in each section. Roanoke, VA is the latest new section. The next Regional Board meeting will be held on February 5th.

The Golf Outing will be held Thursday, June 19th at Pebble Creek. Next year the outing will be held at the Kenton County Course.


