#### ASHE PIN (Political Information Network) REPORT April 2008

#### 1. <u>Commercial Activity Tax</u>

No change in status.

#### 2. NCEES Model Law

Both Ohio and California delegation have written letters to the national ACEC opposing the NCEES Model Law (BS +30 requirement - Bachelors plus 30 hours for PE). There is discussion about moving the effective date from 2015 to 2020.

#### 3. <u>Federal Gas Tax</u>

McCain has called for a suspension of the federal gas tax from Memorial Day to Labor Day. His proposal included a provision to hold the Highway Trust harmless by reimbursing the trust fund with the general fund.

#### 4. Ohio Economic Stimulus Package - \$400 million

The proposal will invest more money into efforts by Ohio local communities to build and maintain aging infrastructure focusing on roads, bridges, sewer and water systems.

#### 5. SAFETEA-LU Technical Corrections

The US Senate (HR 1195) has passed the SAFETEA LU Technical Corrections bill. This would provide additional funding for FHWA research. Two earmark projects, Magnetic Levitation Rail in Las Vegas and Coconut Road Interchange in Florida, were under scrutiny.

#### 6. <u>Senate Budget Resolution Makes Room for Infrastructure Stimulus Spending</u>

The Senate approved a Fiscal Year 2009 budget resolution that would make room for a \$7 billion infrastructure investment package within the next several months, should Congress and the Administration seek a second economic stimulus bill. Sen. Ben Nelson (D-NE) sponsored an amendment that would double the amount slated for "ready-to-go" infrastructure spending. Nelson's amendment proposed to add another \$3.5 billion for a total of \$7 billion. The amendment was approved by the Senate.

#### 7. <u>Transportation Challenges Highlighted by State and Local Government Groups</u>

Several state and local government groups recently released a report outlining the problem of growing transportation needs and diminishing funds to finance solutions. The report also makes recommendations for addressing the transportation crisis, including: immediate action at the federal level to address the looming insolvency of the Highway Trust Fund and assure states and localities of continued promised resources to fight congestion and other transportation problems; agreement at all levels of government that users of transportation systems should cover as much as possible of the cost of providing service; and a wide range of options should be considered when pursuing public-private partnerships to build and improve transportation systems.

#### 8. <u>Federal Infrastructure</u>

The Speaker of the House is proposing a federal infrastructure bank to help pay for roads, subways and other projects that could create jobs and improve the environment. The new debt-selling bank would be an independent federal entity that would evaluate major projects and use various financial tools to fund them.

President Duffy opened the meeting at 11:45 am with the Pledge of Allegiance and the introduction of guests.

Paul thanked everyone who submitted projects. Thirteen were submitted this year.

Next, President Duffy thanked all of the advertisers who support the newsletter and web site. She announced that envelopes containing the Highway Club bills for 2008-2009 were on the table in the hall. The floor was opened for nominations. Hearing none, a motion was made and seconded that nominations be closed. The motion passed.

President Duffy announced that the minutes of the last meeting and the treasurer's report would not be read in the interest of time but were available on the table in the hall.

John Davidson gave the scholarship report. Scholarship applications are due April 25 and members are encouraged to let students know about it. The application is available on the chapter web site. Bill Lawall noted that Triko Valley gives more money to scholarships than other chapters.

Dale Schwietermann filled in for Greg Wilkens and gave the PIN report. The suit related to the Commercial Activity Tax will be filed soon in Franklin County. Ohio and California have sent letters to ACEC National opposing the NCEES model law. President Bush is not in favor of a proposal by several Governors for increased infrastructure spending. Governor Strickland will be in Monroe soon to promote his bond package which would include some money for infrastructure spending.

Jim Collins gave the Regional report. The ASHE National web site has been updated and members are encouraged to visit and give feedback. The next national board meeting will be in Pittsburgh in April where the 2008-2009 budget will be discussed. ASHE has a major expansion plan which will include redrawing regional boundaries. Ohio would probably be in a region with Kentucky, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan and Wisconsin.

Jim also gave the golf committee report. This years outing will be held June 19 at Pebble Creek. The information is on the front table and on the web site. The golf committee will be meeting soon.

Jim Jurgensen, Jr. gave the membership report and noted that the chapter has had a net increase of 11 members.

President Duffy gave the 2010 national conference report. A meeting was recently held of committee chairpersons. A theme of "Transforming Ideas into Mobility" has been selected. A first draft of a master schedule for the conference has been developed. Joe Vogel has obtained information regarding insurance for the conference. The chapter currently has approximately \$20,000 in the bank toward the conference budget. A draft sponsorship plan has been developed which encourages companies to sign up early in order to get discounts. This will only be available to companies in this region. Nathan Moore and the PR committee have been working on a draft logo. Golf will be at Kenton County courses. There is quite a bit of information available at www. ashe2010.org.


