#### ASHE PIN (Political Information Network) REPORT November 2008

With another election season behind us, the Country now has a new leader and path to follow. What does this mean for funding in the transportation industry? It was once thought that Speaker Pelosi would be pushing an economic stimulus package during the lame duck session that would include funding for numerous construction projects. These some 3000 projects needed to be ready for construction bidding within 30-90 days of the passage of the bill. However, with some House Republicans unwilling to pass this proposed bill, Speaker Pelosi is delaying this legislation until the beginning of January, 2009. Similar to Roosevelt's 'New Deal' package during the Great Depression, several groups are taking advantage of this delay to lobby Congress to support the huge boost in spending in an effort to create jobs and kick-start economic growth. The Construction Industry alone is asking Congress to approve \$18 billion for bridges and highways.

In addition to the proposed Economic Stimulus bill, the next six-year Transportation Bill will be decided in 2009. This bill could carry a price tag of as much as \$500 billion and will inevitably be preceded by a heated debate. Many are also recommending doubling the 18.4 cents a gallon gas tax. Without additional revenue sources, the Highway Trust fund does not have enough revenue to support the infrastructure improvements that are needed. This shortfall for FY 2010 is estimated to be 46% of the \$52.4 billion that is expected to be spent in FY 2009.

This is a critical time for our industry. What can ASHE do about this? More than ever, it is important for every member of ASHE to call their Congressional representative to support the additional funding that will be before them in the next Congressional term. ## GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES

#### Tuesday, September 23, 2008 Montgomery Inn

Past President Duffy opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and recognition of two guests.

Bill Lawall presented the Treasurer's Report indicating a current balance of \$4,019.16 (previous balance of \$7,776.80, deposits of \$9,155.10, and expenditures of \$12,912.74). A balance of \$6,000.00 remains in the scholarship fund. There are currently 171 members in the Triko Valley Section with 17 non-paid members. The next meeting will be the holiday meeting on Tuesday, December 2, 2008 at the Montgomery Inn and the next Director's meeting will be held on October 23, 2008.

Secretary Dave Emerick read the minutes from the May 20th general membership meeting. Caroline raised a motion to accept the minutes, which was seconded by Cindy Minter. The motion was carried.

There were 65 golfers and 45 sponsors at the golf outing in June resulting in a \$1,000.00 profit. Jim Collins was thanked for his help with the committee.

In John Davidson's absence, Caroline reported that two scholarships were presented this year.

Jim Jurgensen, II reported that our section is up to 171 members but 17 may be dropped. Our goal for this year is 180 members. We have a good start with the applications received today.

There was nothing to report on the section newsletter.

The NCEAS council passed a motion to delay implementation of the Model Law until 2020. There will be a potential education and regulatory impact. A task force will be ready by the Spring to discuss their findings at the 2009 conference in Kentucky. Many professional organizations are coming out against this law. ASHE will plan on a trip to Louisville to voice our opinion.

Caroline reported that the United States needs \$225 to \$320 billion per year to address our aging infrastructure. Partisan politics coupled with decreased revenues coming into the Highway Trust fund has resulted in problems. SAFETEA-LU bankrupted the highway trust fund this month. President Bush threatened to veto efforts to replenish the \$8 billion borrowed from the trust fund in the 1990's. H. R. 6532 was signed into law on September 12th to transfer \$8.017 billion into the highway trust fund from the treasury general fund, thereby funding SAFETY-LU until July, 2009. The presidential candidates have not elaborated much about transportation. McCain plans to veto congressional earmarks and Obama would create a \$60 Billion infrastructure bank. The ASHE National President, Rich Clifton, has sent a letter to the candidates asking how they will address our infrastructure problems

to help strengthen our economy. The President must work with Congress to address funding issues before SAFETEA-LU moneys run out in July. The letter from Rich Clifton was read to the membership.

Cindy Minter played a video advertisement for the 2009 ASHE National Conference in Georgia. Our section is considering chartering a bus to attend Atlanta for networking opportunities. The committee is looking for donations for the OTEC silent auction and for workers.

December 31st will be the deadline for Schramm Awards applications. There will be two categories- up to \$2 million and over \$2 million.

After lunch was served, Wayne Siler from Construction Process Solutions presented "Highway Claims - How to Avoid Them"

The winning number of 539928 was chosen for the Split the Pot, and \$72 was paid to the winner, Ray Schork of CDS Associates, Inc.

Treasurer Lawall reminded us that PDH certificates were located on the back table and the meeting was adjourned at 1:18 pm.


