# ASHE-TRIKO VALLEY SECTION GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES

TUESDAY, JANUARY 23, 2024 | THE ORIGINAL MONTGOMERY INN, MONTGOMERY, OH

On January 23, 2024, the ASHE-TRIKO Valley Section held the first general membership meeting of 2024. President Todd Gadbury called the meeting to order at 11:39 am, welcoming attendees, and leading the Pledge of Allegiance.

Todd reminded attendees that the 2024 ASHE National Conference will be held in Raleigh, NC from June 5<sup>th</sup> through June 9<sup>th</sup>. Todd also briefly discussed the ASHE & OCA Work forecast for March, and more information will be coming in the next few weeks.

The September 2023 general meeting minutes were raised for approval. Steve Mary made a motion to approve, and it was seconded by Dave Westendorf. The November 2023 general meeting minutes were raised for approval. Steve Mary made a motion to approve, and it was seconded by Dave Westendorf.

Stan Harris was not in attendance and no ASHE National update was presented.

For the Secretary’s report, Dan Springer reminded the attendees that he has the new membership certificates and pins.


Eric Kistner presented the treasurer’s report (see right). A motion to approve the report was not taken.

Caroline Duffy presented the PIN report.

The return of Congress on January 7<sup>th</sup> had the announcement that \$1.7 trillion budge agreement had been reached by Senator Chuck Schumer and Speaker Mike Johnson, which is the first step in averting a government shutdown for the fiscal year that began on October 1, 2023. Congress still had until January 19<sup>th</sup> to negotiate the budget for the Transportation-Housing appropriations. On January 18<sup>th</sup>, the House and Senate passed a stopgap measure to extend the transportation bill deadline to March 1. Speaker Johnson has faced substantial criticism from conservative GOP members for working with Democrats to extend the shutdown deadline.

The Kentucky legislature is currently in session. HB 110 introduces the Governor’s recommended

Transportation Cabinet Budget for approval. Another bill, HB 246, will establish the procedures for the Transportation Cabinet and local governments to enter into a lease agreement with private entities for the naming rights of roads or bridges and for the installation of signage. Here’s to naming the Brent Spence Companion Bridge the “Who Dey” bridge! Stay tuned as the outcome of these bills are decided by the republican lawmakers and the democratic governor by mid-April.

The sale of the Cincinnati Southern Railroad, which is slated in March 2024, will add \$2.6M to the City of Cincinnati coffers to spend annually. The streets and sidewalks wish list includes the following:

1. Mill Creek Road Bridge Rehabilitation;
2. Street rehabilitation;
3. Converting electrical lights to LED;
4. Improving traffic signals citywide;
5. Traffic calming: asphalt speed hump reconstruction citywide;
6. Streetlight replacement in Central Business District; and
7. Replacing pavers in the crosswalks and sidewalks in Central Business District.

Stay tuned for more information on these movements as we move forward in 2024!

# ASHE PIN – March 2024

Congress passed the spending package on March 8th, 2024 that had an original date of September 30, 2023. The overall package represents a good deal that will prevent the shutdown of key federal agencies programs and provide stability in federal funding through to September 30, 2024. The bill unlocks the authorized funding levels for highway and transit formula programs under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act which makes no changes to the advanced appropriations for transportation programs, which is great for the industry. This authorizes \$60.835 billion in Highway Trust Fund formula funding for 2024, plus provides an additional \$9.454 billion in advanced appropriations from the General Fund for 2024. In addition to those totals, the bill provides \$1.88 billion in congressionally directed community project funding, \$100 million for Appalachian highway development, \$50 million for bridge reconstruction and repair in states with low population density, and \$10 million for the regional infrastructure accelerator program.

In Kentucky, Governor Andy Beshear has unveiled a 2024 Recommended Highway Plan featuring more than 1,300 projects throughout the state has been authorized during the 2024 General Assembly. The plan includes almost \$600 million yearly in state and federal funding for 1300 projects. The recommended highway plan is based on anticipated revenues of \$8.65 billion through 2030 – \$7.7 billion in federal-aid highway program funding and the required state match plus \$950 million in anticipated state road fund revenues. During the 2024 General Assembly, funding for the first two years of the highway plan is expected to be authorized on or before April 15<sup>th</sup>.

Ohio is operating under the funding bill that was signed into law last year and will expire next year.

# 2027 National Conference

Three sections, the Derby City Section, Bluegrass Section, and the TRIKO Valley Section, have been awarded the 2027 ASHE National Conference. The conference will be held in Louisville with technical tours, guest events, and entertainment to be held in the geographic region of the three sections. We are looking for volunteers from the TRIKO Valley section for the various committees, as noted below.

1. Financial – Manages conference budget (~\$250k-\$300k), prepares quarterly treasurer’s report, obtain EIN from IRS, prepares yearly tax forms.
2. Sponsorship – In charge of program booklet ads, sponsorships for conference events, maintains master contact list of sponsors.
3. Technical – Plans technical sessions for conference, coordinate AV needs for conference sessions, provide adequate signage to get people to their sessions, coordinate with speakers on their arrival time and obtain speaker gifts, manage CEUs/PDHs.
4. Exhibit – Coordinate exhibition hall, solicit exhibitors, coordinate exhibitor registration with other subcommittees.
5. Program – Develop conference logo/theme, produce conference program booklet, plan opening session, coordinate keynote speakers and awards banquet presentations, investigate electronic program (on mobile devices) in addition to printed program.
6. Registration & Reception – Coordinate online registration platform for conference and develop registration form, provide attendee name tags, handle on-site registration, coordinate attendee hospitality room.
7. Entertainment – coordinate entertainment for opening reception and opening session, past president’s luncheon and evening dinners/banquets.
8. PR/Publicity – Prepare publications for advance coverage to interested parties, prepare ad for 2027 to be printed in the 2026 program booklet, prepare Scanner article publicizing the conference, prepare and maintain conference website, responsible for photography of the conference.
9. Golf – Secure golf course, solicit prizes, establish foursomes, coordinate other off-site “fun” events (i.e. clay shoots, etc.).
10. Transportation – Coordinate shuttles for off-site events, contact local transportation sources about discounted rates for attendees.
11. Guest Program – select and make arrangements for guest activities and establish cost for each activity, provide guest registration material for registration form.
12. Facilities – solicit and procure conference hotel and meeting space accommodations, serve as primary point of contact with hotel facilities.

## 2024 ASHE TRIKO Valley Section Lloyd Wallace Memorial Golf Outing

Our outing is named after Lloyd Wallace, former ODOT District 8 Deputy Director, in tribute to his contributions to the highway engineering field. The outing will be a scramble format with registration beginning at 10:00 am and **shotgun start at 11:00 am**.
