Caroline Duffy was present and provided a PIN report (see below). Caroline did provide an update on the 2027 National Conference in Louisville and encouraged attendees to get involved with Committees by contacting Jason Littleton. The National Conference is currently reviewing the three shortlisted venues.

***ASHE PIN Report***

*On the federal front, the week of July 12 2024, the House Appropriations Committee held two marathon markups where they voted along party lines to approve six of the twelve government funding bills for Fiscal Year (FY) 2025. The legislation advanced out of committee included the Commerce, Justice, and Science; Interior and Environment; Energy and Water Development; and Transportation, Housing and Urban Development Appropriations Acts of 2025.*

*Though the bills have advanced out of committee, they are unlikely to be signed into law in their current form. Rather, the bills represent the House GOP's negotiating position with the Democratic controlled Senate. Among the notable funding changes included in the bills are:*

- A [\\$2.044 billion](#) reduction in Department of Transportation grant programs, 36% below the enacted level for FY24

*The federal government's fiscal year ends September 30th. The Senate Appropriations Committee began marking up the first of its 12 of its annual spending bills on July 11th. It is unlikely that all spending bills will be approved and signed by President Biden before the end of the fiscal year.*

*On the state front, ODOT's financial outlook for the state is being evaluated. Having invested significant funding over the last 4+ years, ODOT's current funding is being eroded by high inflation resulting in a loss of buying power of the Gas Tax revenue, which has eroded to nothing or even slightly negative. A tight contractor market and the contractor labor shortages coupled with an increase in consulting fees, continues to hamper the financial outlook of ODOT. Since 2021, ODOT has experienced a loss in buying power of \$570M.*

*ODOT has had a very consistent programmatic offerings, including large projects. Current funding enables the Department to have projects ready and on the shelf for future funding opportunities. However, cost to update plans already completed is not ideal for design projects as CADD programs and standards are constantly being updated. Continuing on this path for future projects is not a viable long-term option. Therefore, programmatic offerings will likely change with the current 60-80 projects/year not being sustainable for the long-term future. ODOT is also exploring breaking out larger projects into smaller segments to encourage more competitive bids. This has been a successful option for the Department in the past and may be utilized once again.*

*This summer has been very fluid in the upcoming presidential election in November. Please exercise your rights and vote in the presidential election!*

For the Regional Representative report, Katie Dillenburg mentioned that the Great Lakes Region conducted a regional event. The event was a great success. The Richmond I-75 Interchange Project (Schramm Award Winner) won a Regional Award at the event.

Brian Rhodes was not present and had no Membership update. For the Golf Committee Brian provided the following update:

- The Golf Committee will be looking for potential new locations for the outing next year. We have been at Glenview for the past three years. Glenview has been a great host and the outing has been well attended, but we are always open to suggestions on new locations or ways to improve the outing as a whole. Please let any golf committee member know if you have ideas on new locations or ways to improve the outing, they are Brian Rhodes, Jeff Heimann, and Matt Loeffler. Thanks again to all the sponsors and players, you are what makes the outing a success!

Katie Dillenburg informed attendees that the Newsletter will go out within a week or two.

For the Student Chapter report, Shawn Mason was in attendance but had no report.

Steve Mary presented the Program Report. He will have an Ethics presentation by Rebecca Bowman at our next General Membership meeting. Our March 2025 General Membership Meeting will be the annual CIP program, and May will be the Sharon Woods Lake Dredging project.

Samantha Poehner was in attendance and had no report.

For the Social Events report, Kevin Hendrickson discussed a Fall Shooting event for October 18<sup>th</sup> from noon to 3pm at Middletown Sportsman Club. Details to follow.

Dan Ficker gave the Community Service report. The July 20th event was a success, and another event is scheduled for September 28th. An email went out to membership prior to the meeting.

## ASHE PIN – November 2024

Former President Donald Trump will become the next president of the United States. Following the Biden administration, which put billions of dollars into Amtrak, high-speed rail, public transportation and the transition to electric vehicles and buses, what might change under the incoming administration?

On transportation policy that affects cities and states nationwide, Trump has a mixed record. In his first term, he proposed a trillion-dollar infrastructure plan that never came to fruition. He repeatedly tried and failed to cut funding for Amtrak's long-distance trains and attempted to take back nearly \$3.5 billion in already-awarded federal grants for the California high-speed rail project to connect Los Angeles and San Francisco. Instead, the first Trump administration largely favored highway expansion projects. For nearly three years into the five-year Bipartisan Infrastructure law, less than half of the money has been announced, according to the DOT. The \$1.2 trillion federal Bipartisan Infrastructure law, which President Joe Biden signed into law in November 2021, includes \$550 billion in new money, in addition to the Highway Trust Fund. Forty percent of the funding has been announced with more than 60,000 construction projects advancing. Many speculate that with the new Congress being both lead by the Republicans, that the remaining funding for the Bipartisan Infrastructure law will be clawed back to pay for other Trump policies that are proposed to raise taxes. The next highway bill is slated to be passed in 2026. The reauthorization of surface transportation programs in 2026 will largely be led by congressional committees of jurisdiction. As things unfold with the new administration, the next highway bill and its funding source will be closely watched.

# 2027 National Conference

Three sections, the Derby City Section, Bluegrass Section, and the TRIKO Valley Section, have been awarded the 2027 ASHE National Conference. The conference will be held in Louisville with technical tours, guest events, and entertainment to be held in the geographic region of the three sections. We are looking for volunteers from the TRIKO Valley section for the various committees, as noted below.

1. Financial – Manages conference budget (~\$250k-\$300k), prepares quarterly treasurer’s report, obtain EIN from IRS, prepares yearly tax forms.
2. Sponsorship – In charge of program booklet ads, sponsorships for conference events, maintains master contact list of sponsors.
3. Technical – Plans technical sessions for conference, coordinate AV needs for conference sessions, provide adequate signage to get people to their sessions, coordinate with speakers on their arrival time and obtain speaker gifts, manage CEUs/PDHs.
4. Exhibit – Coordinate exhibition hall, solicit exhibitors, coordinate exhibitor registration with other subcommittees.
5. Program – Develop conference logo/theme, produce conference program booklet, plan opening session, coordinate keynote speakers and awards banquet presentations, investigate electronic program (on mobile devices) in addition to printed program.
6. Registration & Reception – Coordinate online registration platform for conference and develop registration form, provide attendee name tags, handle on-site registration, coordinate attendee hospitality room.
7. Entertainment – coordinate entertainment for opening reception and opening session, past president’s luncheon and evening dinners/banquets.
8. PR/Publicity – Prepare publications for advance coverage to interested parties, prepare ad for 2027 to be printed in the 2026 program booklet, prepare Scanner article publicizing the conference, prepare and maintain conference website, responsible for photography of the conference.
9. Golf – Secure golf course, solicit prizes, establish foursomes, coordinate other off-site “fun” events (i.e. clay shoots, etc.).
10. Transportation – Coordinate shuttles for off-site events, contact local transportation sources about discounted rates for attendees.
11. Guest Program – select and make arrangements for guest activities and establish cost for each activity, provide guest registration material for registration form.
12. Facilities – solicit and procure conference hotel and meeting space accommodations, serve as primary point of contact with hotel facilities.
