Caroline Duffy was present and provided a PIN report (see below). Caroline provided an update on the 2027 National Conference in Louisville and encouraged attendees to get involved with Committees by contacting Jason Littleton.

ASHE PIN Report

Yesterday, Donald Trump was inaugurated as the next President. As we look at President Biden's term, the Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill has been game-changer for the transportation industry. In a summary of the last year, the U.S. Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg announced nearly \$5 billion in grants for 560+ projects in all 50 states, D.C., and U.S. territories through seven priority programs funded through President Biden's historic Bipartisan Infrastructure Law. This funding will support state and locally-led projects of all kinds, adding to the more than 72,000 Bipartisan Infrastructure Law-funded projects over the last four years currently moving forward nationwide and the pipeline of projects that will be delivered in the coming years and decades. The department is expecting federal funding to remain steady thru 2027, but also acknowledged there are always unknowns that come with a change in administration in Washington. Appropriations funding for the Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill for 2025 and 2026 will be determined by the new Congress. The ASHE PIN is also looking forward to the reauthorization of the highway bill which is slated for 2026.

The renewal of the Ohio Public Works Commission funding is slated for May 6, 2025. Over the past nine years Ohio Public Works Commission has funded the following projects:

- *\$2.3 billion has been awarded considering for the addition of Revolving Loan Program funds.*
- *4,490 projects have been funded in 1,084 local governments in all 88 counties.*
- *Depending on the year, every \$1 in Ohio Public Works Commission funds has been matched with double to nearly triple the funding from other sources.*

Please pass the word to your coworkers, family, and neighbors to support the Ohio Public Works Commission ballot issue. Yard signs supporting the OPWC ballot issue will be available at the March TRIKO Valley membership meeting.

For the Regional Representative report, Katie Dillenburger mentioned that the Great Lakes Region has interest in scheduling another event. She also mentioned several individual national awards available through ASHE with information available in the newsletter. The Great Lakes Region is looking to fill several positions. Applications are due 3/1/2025. Katie also discussed the National Conference for 2027 in Louisville at the Seelbach Hotel and discussed activities related to the event including a Church Hill Downs event. The Scanner is looking for an article from a Schramm Award winner.

Brian Rhodes was not present and had no Golf update. More information on the Golf Outing will be included in the Newsletter.

For the Membership and Student Chapter report, Craig Litmer was not in attendance and had no report.

Steve Mary presented the Program Report. At the May 2025 General Membership Meeting we will have a presentation on the Sharon Woods Lake Dredging project from Great Parks. The March General Membership Meeting will be focused on CIP and include OCA.

Samantha Poehner was in attendance and provided an update on the National Scholarship which has a March 2025 deadline. The scholarship is \$10,000. Details on the TRIKO Valley Scholarship will be released soon.

Brian Hendrickson was not in attendance and had no report.

Dan Ficker gave the Community Service report. The last clean up event was cancelled due to the weather. There will be another date announced. A survey was sent regarding Community Service and members were encouraged to participate.

Paul Durham was not present and no report for the Website report. The website will be updated as needed and links to the awards and scholarships will be added.

Caroline Duffy presented the ASHE PIN report.

On the federal front, Congress passed a continuing resolution to fund the federal government through September 30, avoiding a government shutdown only hours before funding was due to lapse and the federal government would shut down. The legislation will increase defense spending by \$6 billion and boost border enforcement funding and will cut nondefense spending by \$13 billion, while keeping the funding of Transportation, Housing, and Urban Development programs through September 30 at the same levels as Fiscal Year 2024.

In Ohio, the renewal for funding cycle of the Ohio Public Works Commission will be on the ballot again as Issue 2. Renewed three times since 1987, a group called the Strong Ohio Communities Coalition, a large coalition of groups representing business, labor, public safety, and local governments, has formed to support a YES vote on the May 6, 2025 statewide ballot.

Approval of Issue 2 would allow the state to issue general obligation bonds up to \$250 million per year over 10 years for the continuation of the State Capital Improvement Program (SCIP). The SCIP provides critical funding to local governments for fixing roads, bridges, and other vital infrastructure. The bonds are repaid using existing revenues built-in to future state budgets. Issue 2 plays an important role in our economy. In the past 10 years alone, SCIP has awarded \$2.3 billion in grants and loans to local governments for projects in cities, townships, and counties across the state and has created and sustained tens of thousands of jobs. If approved, it's expected to create an estimated 35,000 more good-paying jobs.

In addition, in the coming days the section will send out an email with information on how to get yard signs as they are not available yet.

Brian Rhodes was not present. Dan Ficker provided an update that the outing will be held on May 1st at Glenview. Signups will be posted soon on the website.

For the Membership and Student Chapter report, Craig Litmer was in attendance and reported that we had 8 additional members since our last meeting. Upcoming student and membership outreach includes meeting with the University of Cincinnati Faculty and Students and implementing a digital membership application.

Steve Mary presented the Program Report. The May 2025 speaker cancelled, and we have a spot available for a presentation.

2027 National Conference

Three sections, the Derby City Section, Bluegrass Section, and the TRIKO Valley Section, have been awarded the 2027 ASHE National Conference. The conference will be held in Louisville with technical tours, guest events, and entertainment to be held in the geographic region of the three sections. We are looking for volunteers from the TRIKO Valley section for the various committees, as noted below.

1. Financial – Manages conference budget (~\$250k-\$300k), prepares quarterly treasurer’s report, obtain EIN from IRS, prepares yearly tax forms.
2. Sponsorship – In charge of program booklet ads, sponsorships for conference events, maintains master contact list of sponsors.
3. Technical – Plans technical sessions for conference, coordinate AV needs for conference sessions, provide adequate signage to get people to their sessions, coordinate with speakers on their arrival time and obtain speaker gifts, manage CEUs/PDHs.
4. Exhibit – Coordinate exhibition hall, solicit exhibitors, coordinate exhibitor registration with other subcommittees.
5. Program – Develop conference logo/theme, produce conference program booklet, plan opening session, coordinate keynote speakers and awards banquet presentations, investigate electronic program (on mobile devices) in addition to printed program.
6. Registration & Reception – Coordinate online registration platform for conference and develop registration form, provide attendee name tags, handle on-site registration, coordinate attendee hospitality room.
7. Entertainment – coordinate entertainment for opening reception and opening session, past president’s luncheon and evening dinners/banquets.
8. PR/Publicity – Prepare publications for advance coverage to interested parties, prepare ad for 2027 to be printed in the 2026 program booklet, prepare Scanner article publicizing the conference, prepare and maintain conference website, responsible for photography of the conference.
9. Golf – Secure golf course, solicit prizes, establish foursomes, coordinate other off-site “fun” events (i.e. clay shoots, etc.).
10. Transportation – Coordinate shuttles for off-site events, contact local transportation sources about discounted rates for attendees.
11. Guest Program – select and make arrangements for guest activities and establish cost for each activity, provide guest registration material for registration form.
12. Facilities – solicit and procure conference hotel and meeting space accommodations, serve as primary point of contact with hotel facilities.
